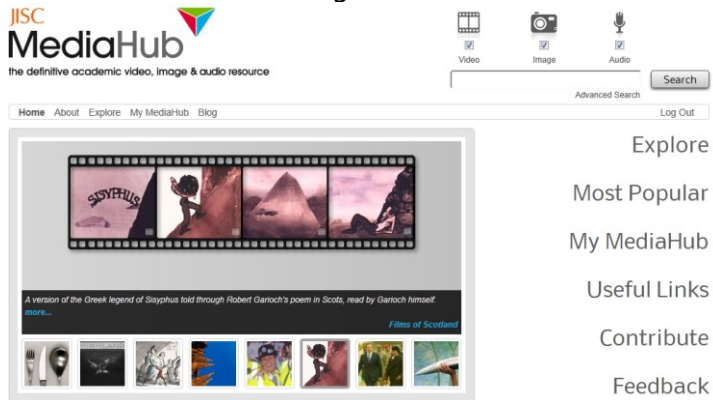


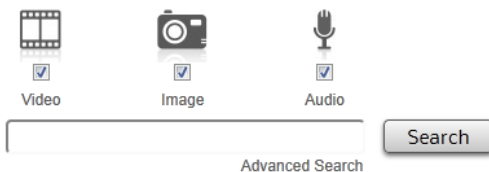
JISC MediaHub Essentials

JISC MediaHub is a new multimedia website for education. You can search for, and browse, video, image and sound files from a wealth of collections:



Searching

A search box at the top right of each page in JISC MediaHub will search all key fields of the JISC MediaHub website.



Search Options




1) You can combine words in the search box using AND, OR, or NOT. If you do not use AND, OR or NOT, the search engine will assume you mean OR.

2) You can search for a phrase by putting double quotation marks around the phrase, for example: **“forth rail bridge”**

3) You can do “wildcard” searches using an asterisk (*), for example: **dog*** will find dog, dogs, dogsled, dogwood, doggerel

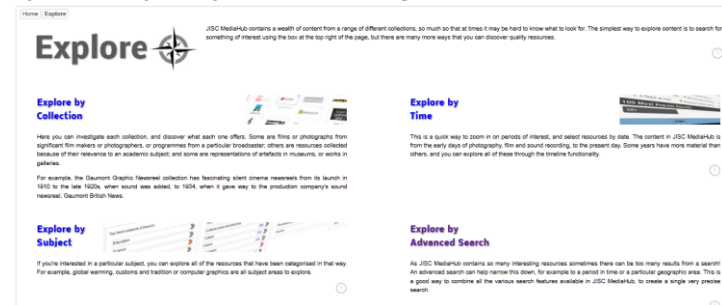
Collection Types

When you search using JISC MediaHub, your results are generated from many different collections. The collection will be one of three types:

-  1. A collection held by JISC MediaHub. You will be able to view/play/download these results within the JISC MediaHub website (provided that your college or university subscribes to JISC MediaHub).
-  2. A collection held by an outside organisation, but to which you will have full access. You will have to leave the JISC MediaHub website to view/play/download these results.
-  3. A collection held by an outside organisation, and to which there may be restricted access. You will have to leave the JISC MediaHub website to view/play/download these result.

Exploring

In addition to searching, you can explore the JISC MediaHub by Collection, by Time, by Subject and through an Advanced Search:



Search Results

The results of your search are arranged in a grid. By default, your results are sorted by relevance. On the left of the screen you can **narrow down your results** by selecting any combination of media type, collection type, collection name, subject or date range. Scroll down to see all options.
